CGS at the RAMA FESTIVAL










On Thursday the 27th of February the school drama club performed at the Kintyre Drama Festival. They have been working on the play Same Difference by Louise Roche.

The band put on an outstanding performance, securing a 5th place finish, which is quite remarkable considering they were competing against mostly adult bands. The following day, Kintyre Schools Pipe Band shone at the Scottish Schools Pipe Band Championships in Kilmarnock. What a weekend of success for our brass and pipe musicians! We're incredibly proud of their hard work and outstanding performances.




